LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of Put-in-Bay Community Swim & Sail,

The 2018 Summer Swim & Sail program ran for five-weeks from June 11 to July 13 and we were able to accomplish our primary mission, which is to provide instruction and training to children, teenagers and adults for the purpose of improving and developing their capabilities in the areas of swimming, sailing, and water safety.

Each year our summer swimmers return and progress to the next level. Our young sailors continue to learn how to handle the boats and are introduced to racing skills. Both the Opti Race Team and Junior Race Team traveled off the island to the 2018 Cleveland Race Week Jr. Travelers Series Regatta at Edgewater Yacht Club, the Carson Cup at North Cape Yacht Club, the ILYA Junior Sailors Travelers Series Regatta at Sandusky Sailing Club and the VBC-PCYC OH Boy! Junior Regatta at Vermillion Yacht Club. We even had a few sailors continue post-season to the 2018 Bob Sessions Memorial Travelers Series #7 at Cleveland Yacht Club. Team PIBCSS and Put-in-Bay Yacht Club had 9 sailors represent our program and club at the Inter-Lake Yachting Association's Junior Race Championship held July 15 to July 19.

On the Fundraising side, our Spaghetti Dinner with raffle continues to draw a crowd raising over \$4,000 in revenue. We also added a Pancake Breakfast that added over \$1,000 in revenue. This year, we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the Ken Gardner/Ballast Island Family Trophy with a successful Gala that brought in over \$17,000 in revenue!

PIBCSS is able to keep its tuition costs low only because of financial support from businesses, families, and island friends. It is important to keep the costs low so that the program is accessible to all who would like to participate in swimming, sailing, or both. A big thank you to all who donated to our program in 2018!

We heavily depend on our countless volunteers to help PIBCSS be successful. We can't thank the friends and parents that have agreed to serve on our board, help with fundraising, and even odd jobs like fixing boats. We have many volunteer opportunities, and if you would like to be more involved please feel free to contact us.

Swim Program Highlights

Swim classes are offered to children four years of age and older. Classes are offered four mornings a week, Monday through Thursday, for five weeks and follow the American Red Cross Learn-to-Swim curriculum. One day a week we incorporate Lake swimming.

We also offer an evening endurance swim class Monday and Wednesday evenings for five weeks. These classes are generally for swimmers who have completed up through Level IV of the American Red Cross Learn-to-Swim Program and seek to improve their strokes and endurance. Many teens continue swimming to stay in shape for high school teams and/or to prepare for additional water safety or lifeguarding courses.

Monday and Wednesday evenings we also had the Lake Adventure Class for ages 12+. Swimmers 14 years and older can prepared to qualify for the Kelly's Island Swim held in July.

Sailing Program Highlights

<u>Start Opti Sailing</u> – (S.O.S.) is our one-week program for 5-7 year olds that will enter the Sailing program during the following season. In 2018 we had 14 sailors sign up. Classes start with becoming familiar with the boats in the Crew's Nest pool, then move on to being towed around the harbor. By the 3rd and 4th class these little ones are sailing by themselves with an instructor just nearby in a powerboat. This is the perfect introduction to what kids will learn in the full Lear-to-Sail classes as they grow.



<u>Opti-Green</u> – In Opti Green, our youngest of the 5 week program, we focus on basics: points of sail, parts of the boat, and steering. While out on the water we focus on drills that are designed to help the kids learn how to maneuver their boat, avoid hitting other boats, and avoid the no-go zone. We often set up a windward leeward course so the kids could sail around practicing all the points of sail, and getting from point A to point B. We also incorporate fun games to keep the kids engaged while they are out on the water.



Opti-Silver — In Opti Silver we start by reviewing the basics that they learned in Opti Green. This class often has a wide disparity in experience level. To accommodate the variety of experience levels, we work on simple drills, like a windward leeward and the sausage drill some days, and on other days we might set up a small course and do some practice races. Towards the end of the program we try to work more on racing and racing strategies since many of the kids in Opti Silver will advance to Opti Race the following year.



<u>420 Silver</u> – In the 420 class we focus on boat handling drills. We incorporate games to promote boat handling. We also hold a few races to give some kids, the opportunity to see what racing is like.



<u>Opti Race Team</u> — Our youngest racers learn more advanced racing skills and travel off the island to Sandusky Sailing Club, Edgewater Yacht Club, North Cape Yacht Club and Vermillion Yacht Club or Port Clinton Yacht Club. We also try to host a home event and invite other teams to compete at Put in Bay. This group, aged 11-14 learned how to travel to events and how to compete in many different conditions. We plan to have more opportunities to compete in the future.

<u>Junior Race Team</u> – Our 420 and laser sailors on our race team also travel off-island with our Opti sailors. This group is our most advanced class. They practice boat handling, racing tactics and techniques. They compete and practice in the most diverse conditions this summer. The coaches work on drills to help fine tune the sailors' skills.

For 2018, we changed our sailing program by reducing the number of days a week a class was on the water and increased individual class times. This allowed more time for sailing farther out and it increased the probability of being able to wait out a storm and still be able to get time out on the water sailing. We also added additional evening sailing time for the Opti Race Team and 420/Laser Race Team one night a week. Overall, the change was well received by our sailing families.

<u>ILYA Junior Race Week</u> – Team PIBCSS and Put-in-Bay Yacht Club had 9 sailors represent our program and club at the Inter Lake Yachting Association's Junior Race Championship. This event is held each year at our home Club, and we were proud to send four 420 teams and one laser sailor to compete in a very competitive four days of racing.

A week filled with fun, camaraderie, education, and sailboat racing!

Equipment and Capital Plan

In 2018, we used a restricted donation to purchase 4 – 420 sails.

We used the generous donation from the Put-in-Bay Rec Committee to purchase 2 program owned paddle boards to assist our instructors with open water swim lessons. The remaining funds from the Recreation Committee donation will be used to purchase a program owned Thistle (as of the end of 2018, transfer of title was still in progress so the actual purchase will occur in 2019).

Our boat fleet consists of 10 420s that are all in satisfactory condition - Some of them need some minor repairs, but nothing major. We also own 16 Optis - some need some minor fiberglass work around the mast step and mast hole. In general, none of our boats are anywhere near "replacement" status. For trailers, we own 1 double stack 420 trailer, and 1 single 420 trailer, 1 double laser trailer and the big Opti rig. We also own 3 Whalers that our instructors use while out on the water with the various classes.

In 2018, the Put-in-Bay High School Sailing Team was allowed to use our 420 boats for instruction and racing in regattas. We will continue to monitor how their use impacts the future condition of our fleet.

Each year we assess the projected class sizes in order to determine our capital equipment needs. For the 2019 summer season, we are projecting that our Opti/420/Laser/Thistle Race team will be its largest classes ever! With that in mind, we need to assess our capacity to be able to send all race sailors to regattas and still have boats left for instructing class, if classes are held on a race day. Our capital plan (which is still being developed for 2019) will include purchasing either new trailers or 420s.




Financial Highlights of 2018






